


New BCECA Membership Grade

Earlier this month, the BCECA Council reviewed the Association's membership arrangements and agreed to introduce a new tiered membership structure that offers the opportunity for wider participation by stakeholders in the energy and process contracting sectors. The new Associate Membership status opens up a pathway for engagement with BCECA's knowledge networks at a lower cost. This development allows increased information sharing and collaboration by giving equipment vendors and consultancies direct access to BCECA's powerful network of engineering contractors.

Benefits of Associate Membership

Associate Members may send representatives to all BCECA committees, working groups and special topic meetings with the exception of Council. Representatives may attend, participate or take on leadership roles and have full access to all documentation and reports.

Associate Members also play a full role in BCECA's undergraduate liaison work. Early-career engineers from BCECA member companies lead outreach activities, including annual industry day events at university engineering departments across the UK.


In addition, Associate Member Companies can:

BCECA Membership Subscriptions

At the recent Council meeting it was agreed that, in recognition of the challenges that the industry is currently facing, the BCECA membership subscription for the 2020/21 membership year would be reduced by 10%. To further help Member companies during this difficult period, Council also agreed that a quarterly payment option would be made available. At this time, when the industry is having to rapidly adapt to new ways of working, there has never been a more critical need for a collective voice for the sector. BCECA has worked hard to ensure that all of its services continue to be available with all committees still fully functioning and meeting virtually.
