The BCECA Board recently reviewed the association's performance against the targets that were set for Year 1 of the 5-year Strategic Plan, so that objectives for Year 2 could be agreed. BCECA's key focus areas in 2022 are to grow membership (in all 3 grades), to run a successful 2nd virtual conference (details will be announced shortly), and to continue to raise BCECA's profile through Marcomms activities. A number of cross-organisation themes have been identified and working groups with representation from across all BCECA committees and Member companies will be established to lead on these topic areas, which include:

- ED&I – with a focus on measuring and improving ED&I both in BCECA and its member companies;
- Global Recruitment and Mobility – looking at the global recruitment, deployment and retention of personnel in the global and virtual world.

ECITB Update

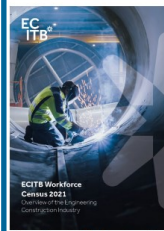

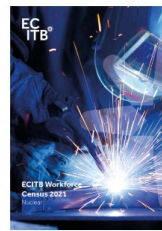

ECITB Workforce Census 2021

In early 2021, the ECITB undertook a Workforce Census of its in-scope companies to collect and analyse the number and location of people in the Engineering Construction Industry and supporting roles. The census survey included demographic information and perception questions surrounding workforce growth, net zero, Covid-19 and Brexit. Fifty percent of the ECITB's in-scope employers responded to the Workforce Census, representing 45,351 workers and 1,360 locations.



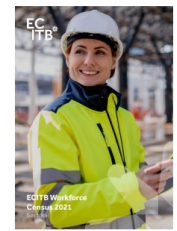
Overview of the Engineering Construction Industry
